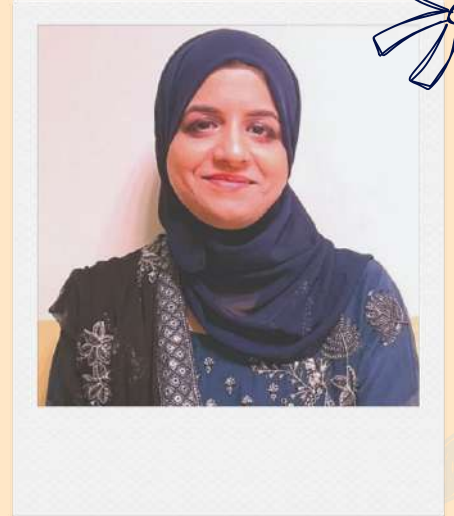

# My First Robot

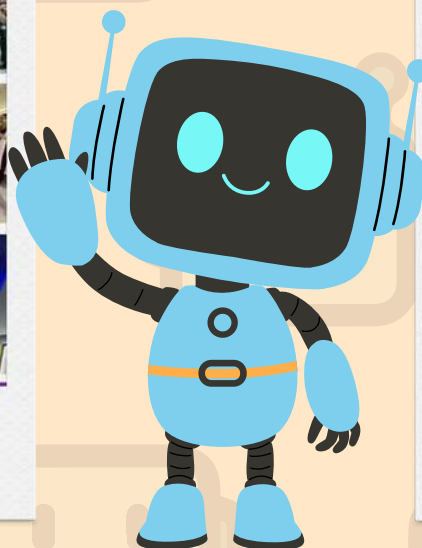
“A spark of curiosity today becomes innovation tomorrow.”

# Garangao Festival

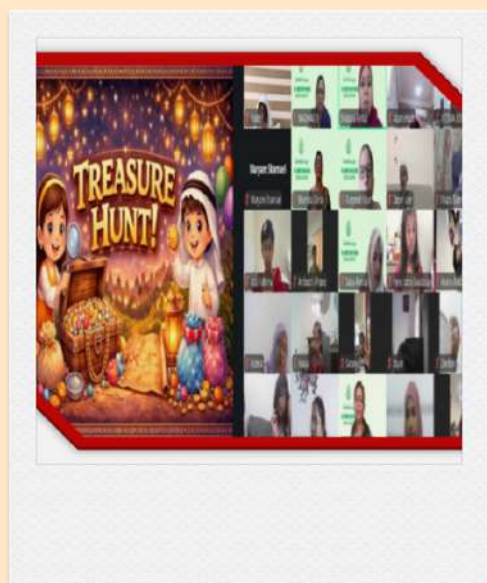
03.03.2026

08.03.2026

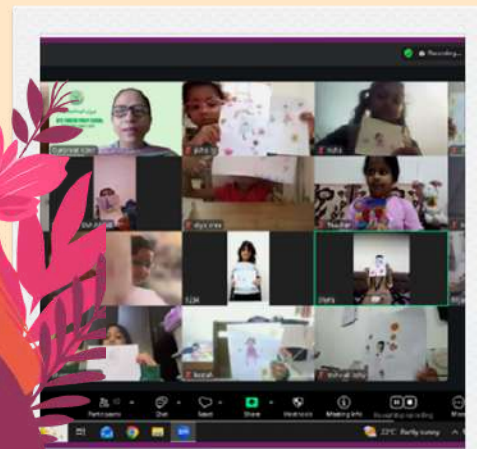
On 8 March 2026, Class Preparatory at DPS–Modern Indian School celebrated International Women's Day through an engaging online session on Zoom.

# Trip Around the city

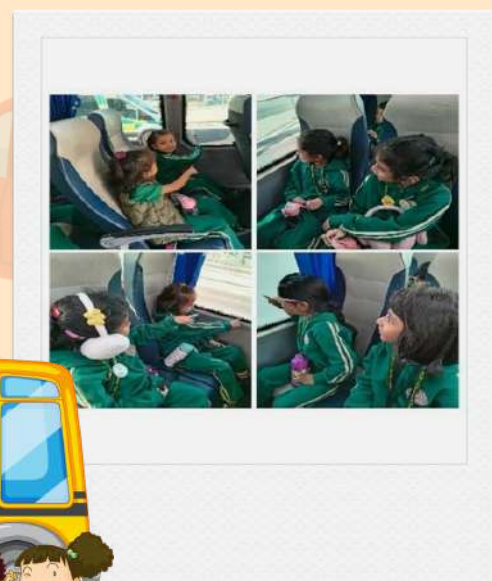
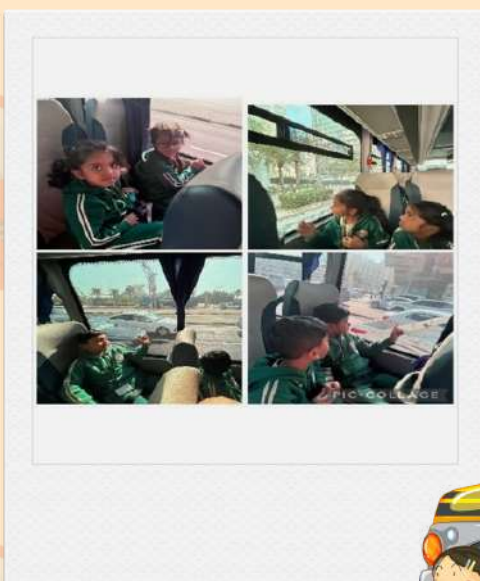
## – Vehicle Adventure

# Around the World Art Carnival

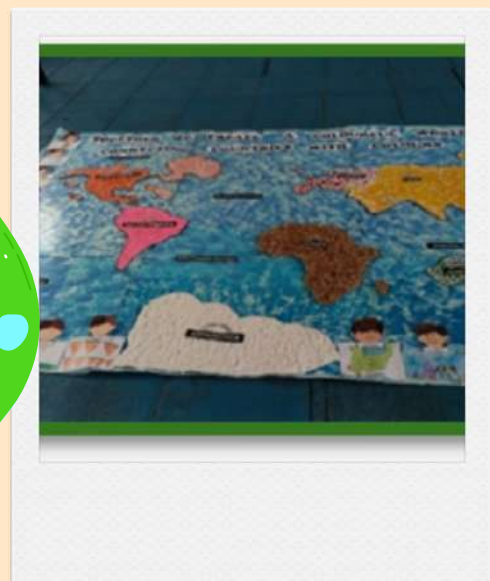

# Two Nations One Spirit

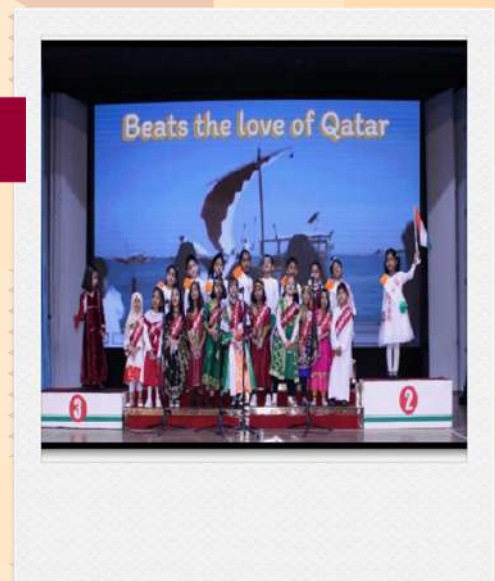

# Ahlan Ramadan Assembly

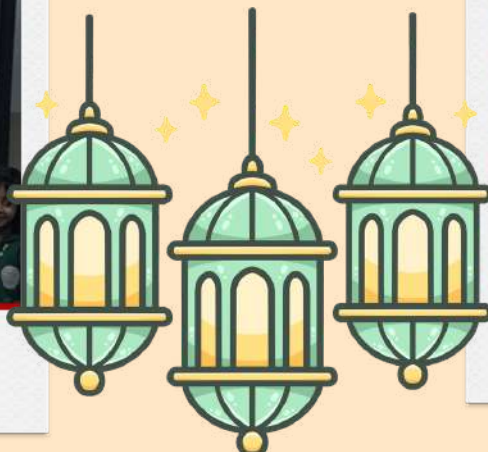
Ramadan is the month whose beginning is mercy, whose middle is forgiveness, and whose end is freedom from fire.

“Every ending is a new beginning. Today we say goodbye to kindergarten and hello to a bright future.”



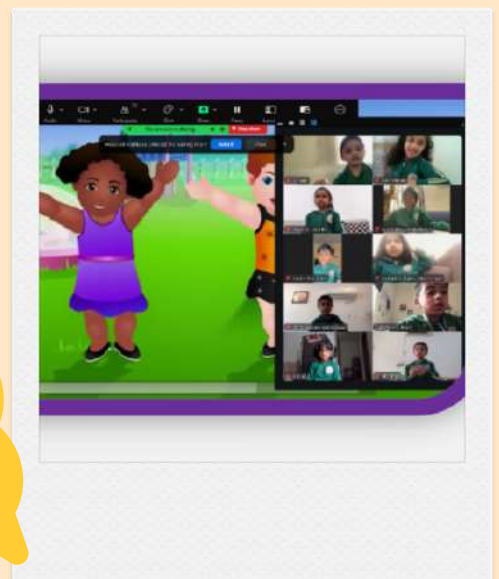
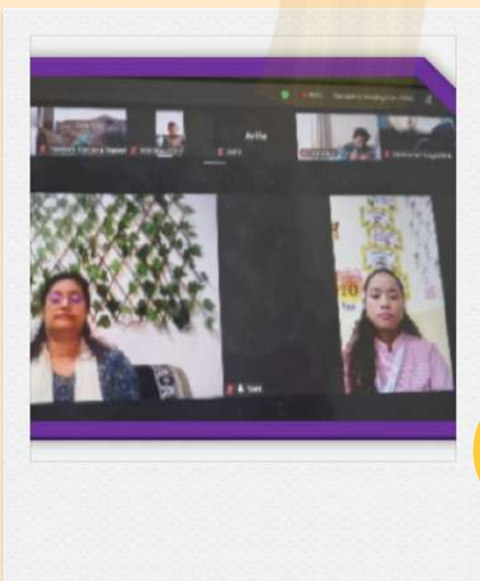
