





CONFERENCE AT A GLANCE

The seventh edition of DPS-DQ MUN unfolded as a landmark event, blending diplomacy, collaboration, and youthful energy over three inspiring days.

The conference began with a vibrant opening ceremony. Mr. Yasir Nainer, President of DPS-Modern Indian School, delivered an inaugural address that emphasized the importance of diplomacy, leadership, and critical thinking in addressing global challenges. He commended the dedication of students and staff in organizing such a prestigious event. The keynote address was delivered by Mr. Sakib Mahmoud, THIMUN Event Specialist, who highlighted the significance of youth participation and dialogue in shaping a more peaceful and inclusive future.

Following the inauguration, committee sessions commenced with great enthusiasm. Delegates confidently presented their opening speeches, quickly adapting to the debate process. By Day 2, discussions grew more detailed and resolutions began to take shape, with delegates demonstrating teamwork and collaboration across blocs. A highlight of the day was the visit of Mr. Yasir Nainer to the committees.

CONFERENCE AT A GLANCE

The debates in the nine committees revolved around the core theme of Peace Through Technology. Each committee had two issues on its agenda.

In the United Nations Security Council (UNSC), delegates discussed “ensuring peace and institution recovery in post-Sudan war” and “addressing maritime security and regional stability in the Red Sea region.”

The Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice (CCPCJ) examined “developing legal frameworks to combat cross-border organised corruption networks” and “safeguarding judicial integrity through international monitoring mechanisms.”

The United Nations Women (UNW) focused on “strengthening women’s leadership in peacebuilding through regional alliances” and “enhancing legal safeguards for women in informal and domestic employment.”

In the General Assembly First Committee: Disarmament and International Security (GA-1), the topics were “enhancing global cooperation to prevent (state-sponsored) cyberattacks on essential infrastructure” and “strengthening compliance with the Biological Weapons Convention and preventing global biowarfare.”
