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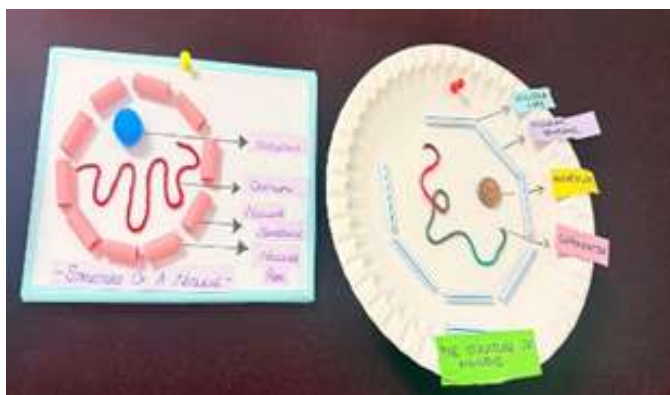
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SCIENCE ACTIVITIES

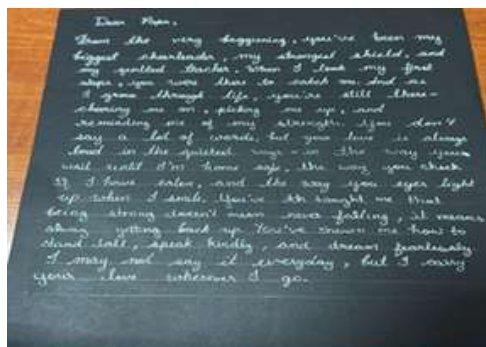
Letters from the Heart: Father's Day Tribute

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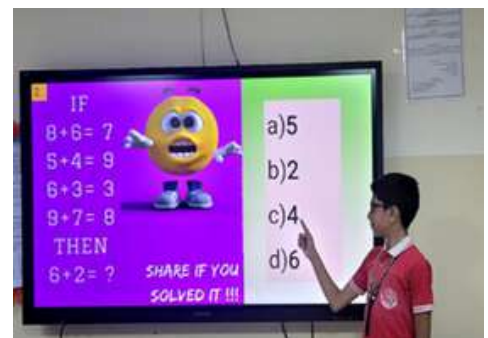
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ACTIVITIES

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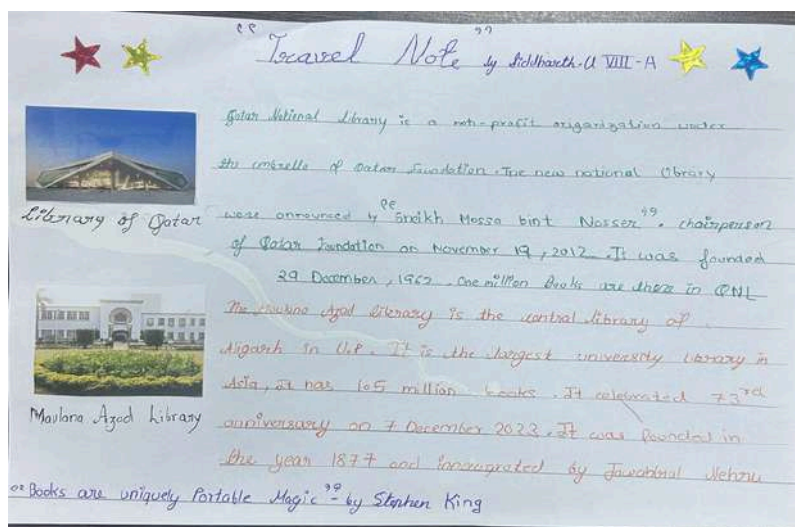
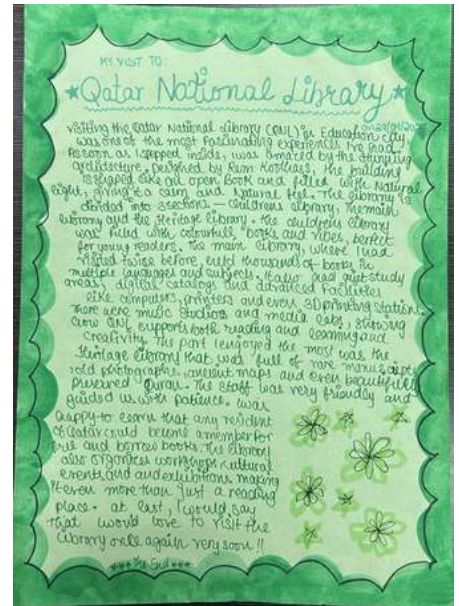

Students visited their hometown libraries and wrote short notes describing their experiences.





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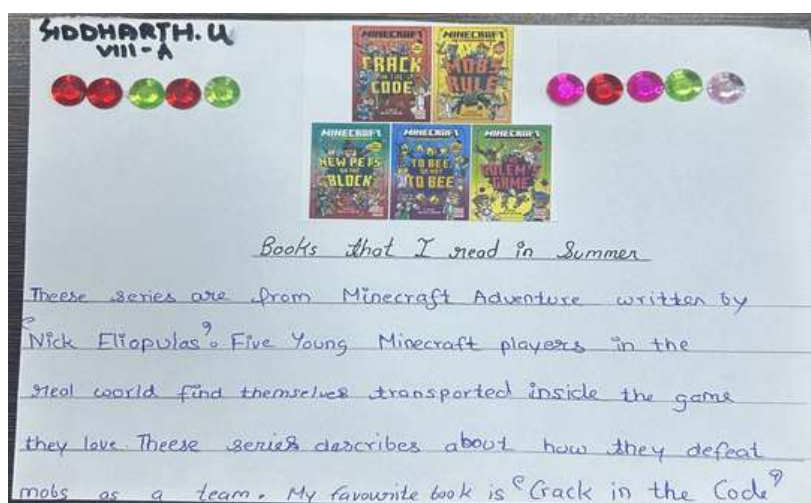
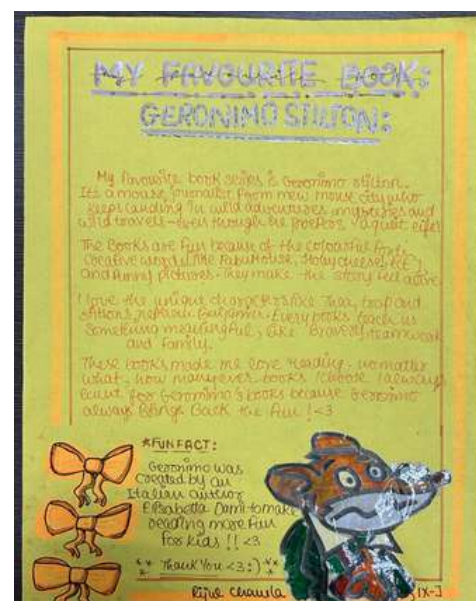
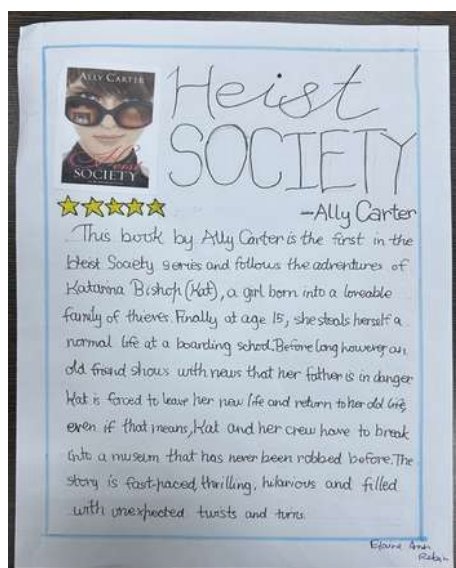
